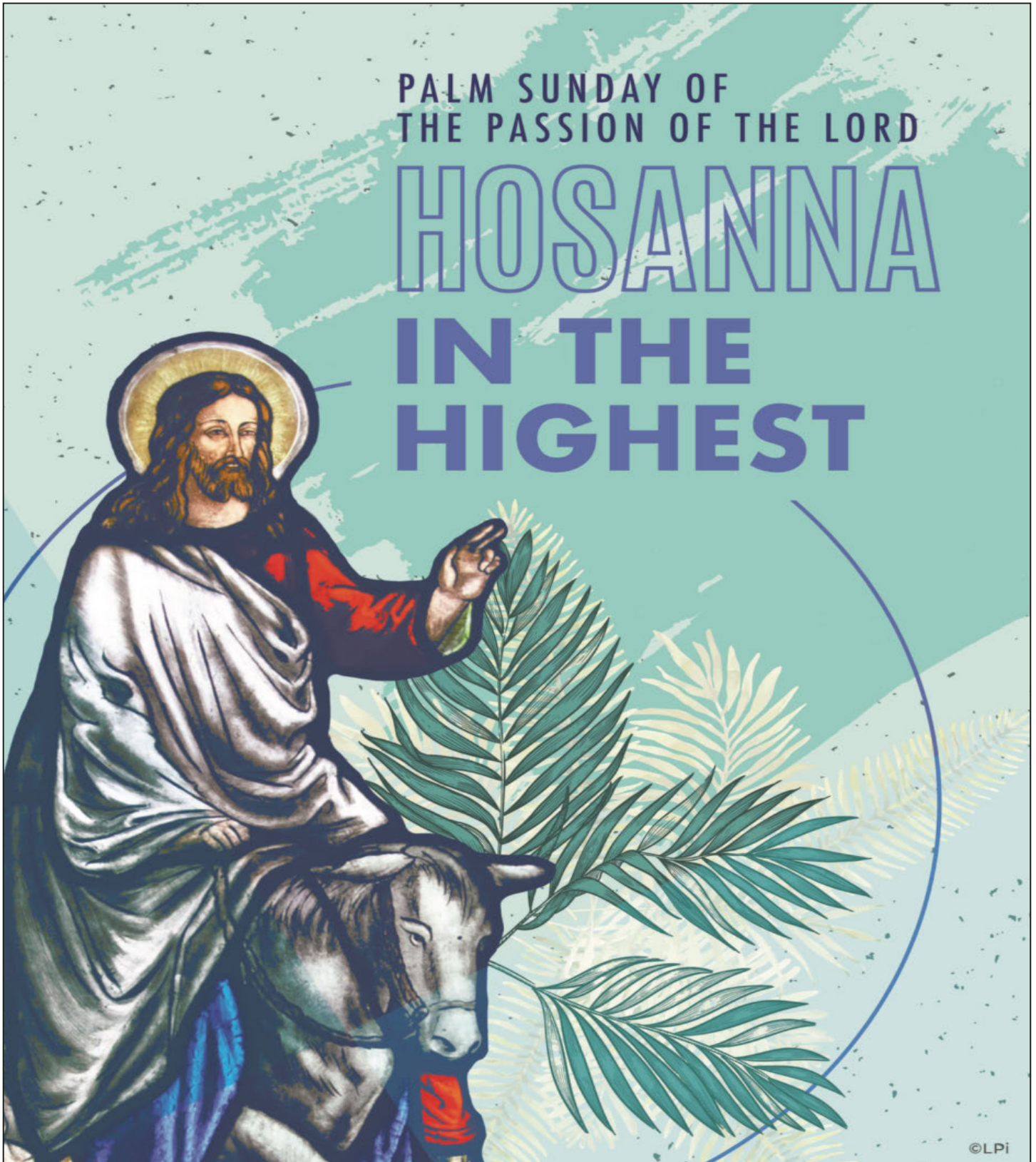

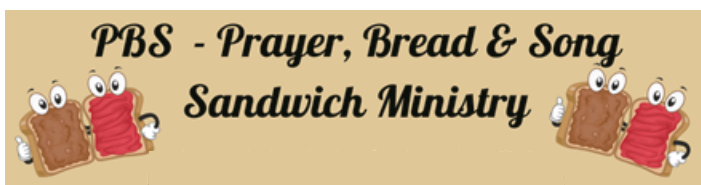
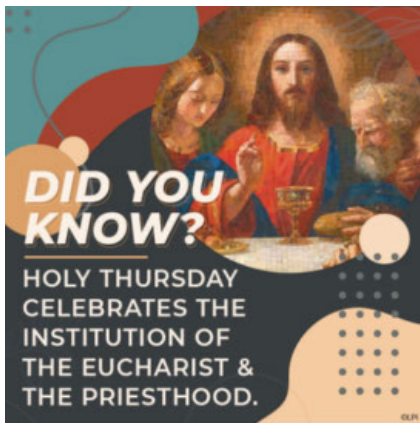

St. Catherine of Alexandria,



Praise be Jesus Christ, now and forever. I thought long and hard about how I wanted to start my first letter to you, and I hit upon that ancient greeting because Jesus really must be the center of it all.

Everything we do and will do together would be for naught if He wasn't. He has changed and impacted all of our lives, and I look forward to meeting Him again and again through, with, and in you. I first met Him, not far from you, growing up in St. Bernadette in Evergreen Park. I was raised in your typical 'small' Irish and Polish Catholic family. My five brothers and two sisters and I were all close in age and learned the faith from our devout parents. With eight kids in twelve years, my mother's cause for canonization, is not without merit. She still lives in the house I grew up in, and still witnesses to me the absolute trust in God I've always seen in her. My father rests in eternity, having passed about ten years ago. Like most of the Southside, I still have siblings, aunts and uncles, and cousins dotting the area.

I wanted to be a priest at a young age and told my mother as a preschooler something to the effect of, "I want to be a priest, a cowboy, and a movie director." Most of that, as you suspect, has not panned out. That said, the most important and authentic call germinated in my heart, even as I grew up and became interested in girls and went to study to be a teacher. It was in college majoring in English Education, that my faith deepened in a meaningful way so that I could respond to the call that was there from that young age. It was friends who invited me on a retreat, and one friend who invited me to start going to daily Mass and adoration, to deepening my prayer life. That changed everything. Never doubt the power of a good invite from a friend. I entered seminary after graduation and was ordained in 2016. My first assignment was also nearby at Christ the King where I left during the 'peaceful' and 'uneventful' virus-filled year of 2020. I went to St. Clement where I have been the last four years. I have loved and felt loved at both of my assignments. I have grown closer to God and become a better priest and man because of them. I hope and expect my time at St. Catherine's to be as mutually life giving.

Like all young priests, I have a lot of ideas and goals and plans. But my first and main task will be getting to know and love you, (as the saint said) all the Christ that is in you, and for you to know Jesus through me. When I was at Christ the King, I got the opportunity to say Mass and hear confessions occasionally at St. Catherine's. Besides being basketball and volleyball powers, I saw your families, and your faith. I got to see the wonderful gifts they are. I look forward to journeying with you, to shepherding you, praying with you, meeting Christ again and again with you.



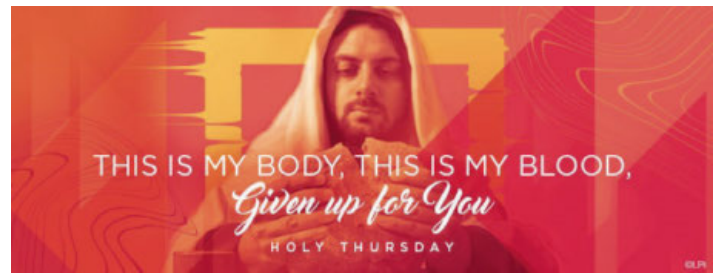

Vocations

A vocation is a call from God, and anyone who has felt God's call knows that the process is anything but simple. First of all, we're all called to be holy. But we need to find out how we're meant to live out that call. Some of us may be called to do it within the perspective of raising a family; others may be called to the religious life.

Many of us struggle to find a balance between what we want to do and what we think we should do when choosing a career or path in life. We often get stuck in "survival mode," forgetting to contemplate the deeper meaning of our calling in the business of our daily lives. However, it's important to ask ourselves whether we're living out our lives according to God's will. When we let go of random and external expectations and pursue joy and fulfillment, we can begin to explore our vocation.

A person can have many different callings in life. For instance, a person can have a calling to marriage, to motherhood, to fatherhood, and/or to Religious Life. In the Catholic worldview everything we do should be ordered toward discerning and responding to the will of God.

In any of the stages of life God calls us to build up our society in a manner that reflects the love of God. This is our general vocation as Christians. Even through work God wants us to build his kingdom. God calls us to meaningful work that brings value to humanity; work that does not exploit people for personal gain. In your occupation, ask yourself each day how your work will bring glory to God and help people rather than take advantage of others for personal profit.

Each vocation requires some sacrifice, to die to self in the service of others. Perhaps this is the true meaning of vocation. Through serving others we act as God to others, and we become more and more like Christ each day. While we might sin and fall short of what God desires for us, God still calls us to faithfully live our vocations in the hope that we will be with God in heaven some day.

Last Friday, the Archdiocese of Chicago Vocations Office visited SCA school, and it was a wonderful experience. Seminarian John Rahimi, along with the Sisters of the Holy Family of Nazareth, Sister Molly and Sister Incarna, gave us a great talk about their chosen vocations. Through their commitments and testimonies, we truly understood that even though they discerned to follow God through a religious life, they are never alone. They showed us that God is with us every moment of our lives.

Together, let us continue to hope and pray on our journey through Lent.

St. Peregrine is the patron saint for persons suffering from illnesses of all types in particular cancer. Saint Peregrine was healed of a cancerous ulcer on his leg which was considered beyond saving. The fame of this event in 1325 spread rapidly around the western Church.

Christians, and especially the sick, began to invoke his name and seek his intercession for the relief of their suffering and even for a cure from sickness. The canonization of St. Peregrine in 1726 increased people's devotion to him which spread to the universal Church.

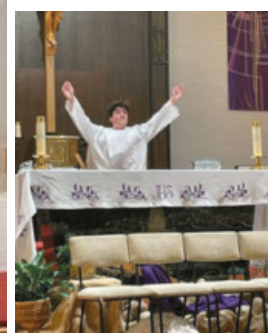

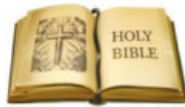

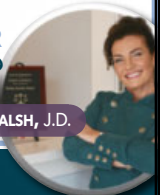
