THE PASCHAL SEASON

40/3/50

All the days, from Ash Wednesday to Pentecost, are our **Paschal** (Passover) **Season.** The **40** days of **Lent** and the **50** days of **Eastertime** surround the **Triduum**, the **Great Three Days** from Holy Thursday evening through Easter Sunday evening. This entire season has a unity founded in the Easter Vigil and visibly expressed in the recalling of our preparation for initiation during Lent and the continued celebration of baptismal death and resurrection in Christ during Eastertime. To put it another way, we seek renewal and deeper conversion during Lent so that we might come to new life during Easter and, in turn, go forth at Pentecost with the power of the Spirit to transform the world.

Triduum

The Great Three Days, the Easter Triduum, is the center of the year for Christians. Everyone in the community is invited to plan ahead so that the whole time, from Thursday night until Easter Vigil, is free of social engagements, free of entertainment, free of meals (except for the simplest nourishment), free even of work, if possible. We are asked to fast during Good Friday and to continue fasting, if possible, through Holy Saturday as strictly as we can, so that we come hungry and full of excitement to the Easter Vigil. We make Good Friday and Holy Saturday free for prayer, reflection, preparation and silence. The Church is getting ready.

Whether you are young or old, currently active in the parish or not, please set these days aside. All of us should know that our presence for the **three-day** liturgy is not just by invitation. We are all needed here on these, our greatest days.

On these **three days**, we gather several times. Together we hear some of the Church's most beautiful prayers and scriptures, and we make some of our finest music. Please look closely at the following schedule and make plans to take part in these **three days**. Above all, come on Saturday night for the Vigil.

Day 1

The first day of the Triduum, from Holy Thursday sunset to Good Friday sunset, is like the sixth day of creation when God formed us from clay and breath. In dying, the Lord Jesus fell asleep, like Adam, that we might be formed from his own body, like Eve, a new creation.

The Mass of the Lord's Supper will be celebrated at 7:00 PM on Holy Thursday, April 6th. After listening to the scriptures, we wash the feet of selected members of our community in tender humility, imitating Jesus who gave us this image of what we, the Church, the Body of Christ, is supposed to look like, feel like, act like. We then celebrate the Eucharist, a sharing in the Body and Blood of Christ that is best expressed in the way we serve and minister to one another. This evening liturgy has no dismissal, no ending. We are now in the quiet, the peace, and the glory of the Triduum. We follow the Blessed Sacrament in silent procession in Church for adoration until Midnight.

Day 2

The second day of the Triduum, beginning Good Friday sunset, is the Sabbath. Celebration of the Lord's Passion will be at 7:00 PM on April 7th. We gather in the quiet and listen to scripture. We pray for the needs of the world. The holy cross is held up in our midst and we come forward to do reverence with a kiss, a bow, or a genuflection. No Mass is celebrated, but we receive Communion as a sign that Jesus' death nourishes our life. In burial the Lord Jesus rested, and we rest with him, through the night and into the next day. This day is an image of the timelessness before time began. In death the Lord Jesus entered the "formless void," the utter nothingness before creation. On this day we continue our fasting. We keep watch, learning the lessons of restfulness, silence and darkness. We reserve this day, unique in all the year, to do nothing at all.

Day 3


This third day of the Triduum begins Holy Saturday at sunset. Hungry now and full of excitement, the Church gathers in the darkness and lights a new fire and a great candle that will make this night bright for us. We listen to some of our most powerful scriptures: stories of creation, Abraham and Isaac, Moses and the crossing of the sea, poems of promise and rejoicing, the gospel of the resurrection. Once again we raise our voices in joyful praise as we sing the Gloria and Alleluia for the first time since Lent began. We pray for all our saints to stand with us as we go to the font and bless the waters. These are the moments when death and life meet, when we reject evil and give our promises to God. All of this we do in the communion we call Church. Together we go to the table and celebrate the Easter Eucharistic Feast. Easter day begins and we are ready for Fifty Days of rejoicing. "THIS IS THE DAY THE LORD HAS MADE, LET US REJOICE AND BE GLAD, ALLELUIA, ALLELUIA!








Lotiang Ekutan poses for a portrait with one of his sons at his home in Turkana, Kenya. Rebecca and her husband Lotiang farmed and raised livestock for several years, but more frequent and severe droughts attributed to climate change have made farming difficult. Through a CRS program—in collaboration with the diocese of Lodwar in Kenya—a new well equipped with a solar plumbing unit was constructed in Rebecca and Lotiang's village. They can now access water to irrigate their fields and take care of their goats. They also learned new farming techniques through the program, such as how to grow kale, which they use to feed their family and sell at the market. Rebecca and Lotiang share what they have learned with others in their community so everyone can benefit.



Their guests were treated to songs, a little breakfast and some play time with their preschool host.







None of us have ever endured the same pain that Jesus went through and praise God for that. However, in our life I know sometimes we have uttered these very words that were proclaimed in today's Psalm. We have wondered where He is in the midst of our pain and we wonder where He was. Can I tell you something? He never left. He was on the Cross. I love that in every Catholic hospital room there is a crucifix. This is comforting because it shows me that my God knows what pain is like. My God knows what I'm going through. I don't want to serve a God that can't relate to me! Why would I want to? But, He knows your pain and He knows your name. You are never alone. We listen to the Passion of Jesus today and the pain He went through makes us feel awful. I am reminded of what one theologian said, "We cannot have Sunday without Friday." This means we can't have Easter Sunday without Good Friday. In essence, this means we can't have resurrection without death. I want to say the same thing to you-you can't have healing unless there's pain. You too will rise again. May the Blood of Jesus that was shed on the Cross and that we our nourished by in the Eucharist, give you strength to carry on in your pain knowing that we will rise again one day with Him.



Help Needed to Promote St. Catherine



You are invited to bring your baskets containing a sampling of Easter foods that will be enjoyed at your Sunday Easter dinner, to be blessed on Holy Saturday. Though this has been a Polish tradition, many families have adopted this custom. The basket traditionally was lined with a white linen or lace napkin. Baskets can be filled with colored hardboiled eggs symbolizing the new life of the Resurrection: a sugar or butter lamb representing Christ the Lamb of God; bread or a tall decorative 10 cake called Babka, along with ham, sausage, salt and pepper.

Domestic Violence and Where to Go For Help

The South and Southwest Suburbs are blessed to have multiple full service domestic violence providers. Access is by calling their Hotline which provides confidential help and services. There is no cost for any of the services these two Agencies provide. A brief summary of their services and contact information are listed below:

The Crisis Center South Suburbia and Pillars Community Services offers Emergency Shelter services, interim and transitional housing, and emergency financial assistance to individuals and families on their journey to safety and independence. They also offer support and screening to victims of domestic violence at area hospitals and advocacy for victims at court hearings. They have relationships with local law enforcement and often serve victims who come to the attention of the police. They provide both crisis intervention advice and longer term counseling to victims of abuse and their children.


