Second Sunday of Easter: Feast of The Divine Mercy

Acts of the Apostles 5: 12-16; Book of Revelation 1: 9-11A, 12-13, 17-19; Gospel of John 20: 19-31

Divine Mercy Sunday (or the Second Sunday of Easter) was officially designated by Pope St. John Paul II in 2000 at the Canonization of St. Faustina Kowalska.

From the beginning of his time as our Pope, our Holy Father Francis has had “Mercy” as an ongoing theme.

The readings reflect that theme of mercy. Our First Reading is drawn from the Acts of the Apostles and it declares the works, the acts that is, of the Apostles in the early days. They go about the countryside performing “signs and wonders.” In effect it declares that “they all were cured,” meaning God’s love and forgiveness is available and open to everyone, absolutely everyone. **There is no limit and no restrictions on God’s mercy.**

In the Second Reading from Revelation the scripture scholars agree that the voice John heard was the voice of Jesus, a voice with which he would have been very familiar. John sees Jesus in all His glory, and he receives instructions from Him to write a book of what he has seen and witnessed. Witness to faith, witness to the Lord, are important parts of a disciple’s experience. Each of us, like John, is called to witness.

This is the first time, as recorded in Revelation, that John is commanded by the Lord to write. However, he receives that command eleven more times in this Book. It is difficult to really ascertain exactly what John thought and felt at that moment. John was overcome and in awe. Here was Christ in all His glory! John had spent three years with the Lord while He was among them. John reports that Jesus “touched me with His right hand and said, ‘Do not be afraid’.” This is the God of love, the **God of mercy**, who comforts in compassion.

The Gospel from the Book of John would seemingly be one of the results of the command to write what John has seen. Much of the attention on this Gospel has been given to Didymus, the Apostle Thomas, and the resulting term “doubting Thomas.” However, the meaning in terms of mercy is much deeper than that. When Jesus appears among the Apostles, the Lord’s first words are “Peace be with you.” These are the words of a forgiving and merciful Father. They may have expected to be scolded for their desertion of Jesus on Good Friday; nevertheless, the Lord comes with words of reconciliation.

Jesus commissions them, just as He has commissioned each of us, to continue His work on earth. The Lord blesses them with the Holy Spirit and breathes new life into them, just as His Father breathed life into all of humankind at the time of creation. He grants them, and thus the Church’s priests and clergy, the authority to forgive. We can be forgiven; God’s mercy extends to each of us.

Divine Mercy Sunday and the Chaplet of Divine Mercy

In the 1930s, Sister Maria Faustina Kowalska of the Most Blessed Sacrament, a Sister of Our Lady of Mercy, received a message from the Lord that she was to live her life as a model of Christ’s merciful love and to spread Christ’s mercy throughout the world. She proceeded to offer up all of her personal sufferings in atonement for the sins of others. She kept a secret diary in which she wrote of God’s mercy as well as about her special devotion to Mary Immaculate and to the sacraments of the Eucharist and Reconciliation, which strengthened her. Sister Faustina’s diary, Divine Mercy in my Soul, serves as the handbook for the devotion to the Divine Mercy. In it, we read of the message of mercy that she received from Christ.

On April 30, 2000, Sister Faustina Kowalska was canonized by Pope John Paul II. Then, on May 23, 2000, the Congregation for Divine Worship decreed that “throughout the world, the second Sunday of Easter will receive the name Divine Mercy Sunday, a perennial invitation to the Christian world to face, with confidence in divine benevolence, the difficulties and trials that humankind will experience in the years to come.”

On Divine Mercy Sunday (April 16th), all are encouraged to pray the Divine Mercy Chaplet, always remembering and practicing the essential ABCs of Divine Mercy –

Ask for mercy; be merciful to others; and completely trust in Jesus.

Format of the Divine Mercy Chaplet

“Chaplet” simply refers to the prayers counted on a rosary.

The Lord said to St. Faustina:

“You will recite this chaplet on the beads of the Rosary in the following Manner:”

Begin with: One “Our Father,” one “Hail Mary,” and the “I Believe in God.”

On the “Our Father Beads” say:

Eternal Father, I offer You the

Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Your dearly beloved Son, Our Lord Jesus Christ, in atonement for our sins and those of the whole world.

On the “Hail Mary Beads” say:

For the sake of His sorrowful Passion, have mercy on us and on the whole world.

In conclusion, three times recite these words:

Holy God, Holy Mighty One, Holy Immortal One, have mercy on us and on the whole world.

“I want the whole world to know my infinite mercy. I want to give unimaginable graces to those who trust in my mercy.”
(Diary, 687).

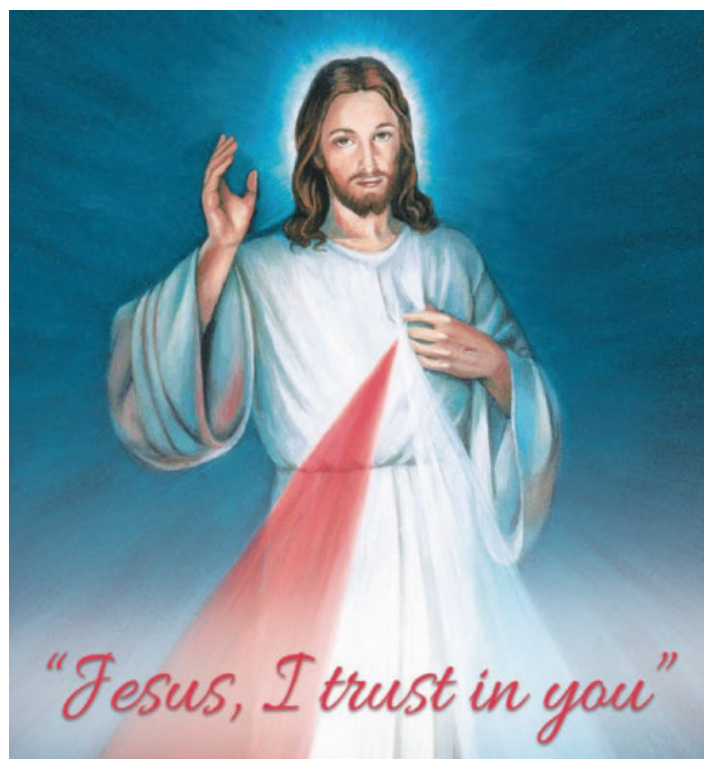


STATIONS OF THE RESURRECTION

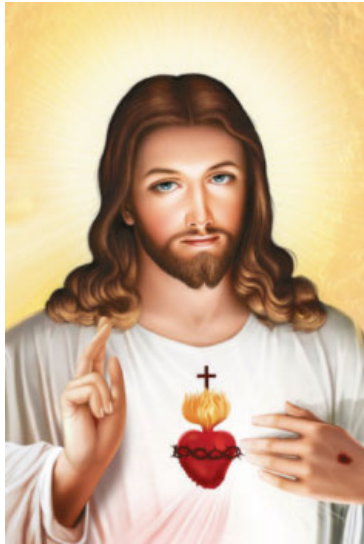

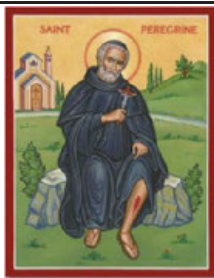

St. Peregrine is the patron saint for persons suffering from illnesses of all types in particular cancer. Saint Peregrine was healed of a cancerous ulcer on his leg which was considered beyond saving. The fame of this event in 1325 spread rapidly around the western Church.

Christians, and especially the sick, began to invoke his name and seek his intercession for the relief of their suffering and even for a cure from sickness. The canonization of St. Peregrine in 1726 increased people's devotion to him which spread to the universal Church.
