My Dear People of St. Catherine,

During the years I have been your pastor, I have witnessed your generosity in so many different ways. So many of you have given of your Time, Talent, and Treasure to share the Good News of the Kingdom of God and to further the Gosppel.

Kingdom of God and to further the Gospel Message. Jesus loves us. He saved us. He gives meaning to our lives and sense of purpose beyond what this world can give. We sense his presence in our lives through the sanctifying presence of the Holy Spirit and through the celebration of the Eucharist.

We are called to take up the Mission of Jesus Christ and make disciples. Consider how you can further support the mission of St. Catherine Parish. On the following page, the sacramental life of St. Catherine is highlighted. A small but dedicated staff helps to make all this happen. Salaries are a big portion of our operating expenses as well as benefits. We also need to maintain our church which we worship in and all the buildings which we gather in. This is another ongoing expense. Our ongoing maintenance and improvements to our facilities are most important. Deferred maintenance only leads to greater expenses down the road.

The other component of this financial appeal is the support of Evangelization. Efforts like Alpha and Adult Faith Formation need our support so that we can welcome even more people into these programs. To prepare our children to celebrate the Sacraments of Reconciliation, First Eucharist and Confirmation, requires the commitment of dedicated people. Please take the time to read page 3 and begin to prayerfully reassess your financial commitment to St. Catherine. To put it very directly, income has not kept up with expenses. We are running a deficit, forcing us to withdraw from our savings. Mass attendance remains down since COVID, and that is why evangelization efforts are so important and need to be supported. The Finance Council also decided that it would be good to piggy back our Financial Report to give you a clear idea where we stand. Please take the time to read these reports. It is our desire to be transparent with our Finances.

This is the fourth weekend for our annual October Count. Our count for Week 1, 2 & 3 is 628+773+848 for an average of 750. In 2019, Pre-COVID, the first three week average was 1000. Please continue to invite others you know to Mass.

Remember that November 1, All Saint's Day, is a Holy Day of Obligation. Anticipated Mass Tuesday at 7:00pm, and Wednesday at 6:30am, 8:30am, and 10am. No evening Mass on November 1. The Blood Drive is next Sunday, November 5; signup online.






Our Sacramental Life

St. Catherine Parish is blessed to have a pastor and an associate pastor to administer and celebrate the sacraments with the help of a dedicated staff. Music and Liturgy planning enhance our celebrations as well as providing a digital means of reaching those who cannot be present at our Sunday Mass. We offer 5 Weekend Masses and a daily Mass. In Fiscal Year ending June 30, 2023, we had 53 Baptisms, 70 First Eucharists, 55 Confirmations, 7 Marriages, and 52 Funeral Masses. Our campus requires on-going repairs, maintenance, insurance and snow removal. Having electricity, gas, and needed supplies is essential when providing the sacraments with our faithful community. We continue to serve our Parish community while feeling the effects of a down turn in Sunday Collections from pre-COVID times.














We were fortunate to have very special guests in our building over the past couple of weeks.


On October 18, we celebrated Grand Friends Day at SCA. On October 23, students from the Adult Transition Program of District 218 came to read to our students.

Family Faith Formation Office - All Souls' Day



The Feast of All Souls, or All Souls' Day, is a day set apart for honoring all who have died. In Mexico, this feast is commonly known as The Day of the Dead. The official name for this feast in the Roman Rite of the Catholic Church is: **The**

Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed. It is celebrated on November 2nd and is NOT a Holy Day of Obligation. It is often confused with All Saint's Day, which IS a Holy Day of Obligation. While the two feasts are somewhat related, they do, in fact, have their differences.

All Souls' Day is a day that reminds us to honor the souls of all who have passed away, especially those who have not yet reached Heaven. It may seem like a sad or scary occasion to have a feast in their memory, but it shouldn't be. This feast should serve as a valuable reminder of our identity and purpose. It should also be a special day to cherish the memories of our departed loved ones.

There is a Mexican saying that people die three times: the first is when they die; the second is when they are buried; and the third is when they are forgotten. Celebrating All Souls' Day is one way to never forget those who have gone before us. Therefore, many Hispanic homes prepare an Altar with pictures of their loved ones and flowers to commemorate those we loved but are not here with us.

Let us pray together for all these wonderful souls that taught us so much, but sadly are not with us any longer. May the good Lord grant them eternal peace.




