

Oplatki—The Christmas Wafer

Opłatek (singular-pronounced opwatek) is also known as the Christmas Wafer or Angel Bread. While it is a traditional Polish custom, many families have included the ritual as part of their Christmas Eve or Christmas Day family meal. Opłatki (plural-pronounced opwatkey) is made from unleavened bread similar to a host, and pressed into rectangles with an outline of a Nativity Scene imprinted on the surface.

At the Christmas Meal, the head of the house begins sharing a piece of Opłatek with the other members of the family who are gathered around the table. Each family member breaks off a piece of the Opłatek to share. As the pieces are broken and shared, greetings of a holy Christmas and a healthy New Year are exchanged. The ritual is a reminder of who comes to us at Christmas, and why. It is also a symbol of forgiveness.

Oplatki is available in the church vestibule and at the rectory office. (Donation: \$5.00 per packet)

My Dear People of St. Catherine,

This weekend we light the pink candle on our Advent Wreath. This Sunday is called Gaudete, Latin for "Rejoice," Sunday. The entrance antiphon of the Mass is: "Rejoice in the Lord always; again I say, rejoice." Indeed the Lord is near. We are halfway through Advent and Christmas is fast approaching. The priest has the option of wearing a pink chasuble in place of the normal purple vestment.

In the First Reading, the prophet Isaiah says, "I rejoice heartily in the Lord, in my God is the joy of my soul; for he has clothed me with a robe of salvation." And in the second reading from Paul's Letter to the Thessalonians, he writes, "Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you." We rejoice because we are infinitely loved by God the Father, who sent us his Son to be born as a child so that we might be saved. We should pray always to deepen our relationship with Jesus, which gives us much joy. In the Advent & Christmas Daily Reflections Book 2023-2024, page 39, the author Susan H. Swetnam writes: "Loving God, may a gentle spirit of joy fill and heal my heart today."



On Saturday, October 21, a number of parish organizations helped to host our FUN Raiser, featuring Dueling Pianos. The evening was a wonderful success and a lot of fun for all. I thank the following parish organizations which helped with organizing, promoting, and supporting this event: 55+ Club, Family School Association, School Advisory Board, Men's Club, Athletic Association, and Parish Pastoral Council. As was remarked, it was nice to see such a range of ages: young adults, adults, and seniors coming together for such an event, enjoying the music which spanned the decades. About 260 people enjoyed the evening. Though the event was primarily meant to bring people together in fun and fellowship, we did profit \$7,139. Expenses were \$5,896, which included the \$3,200 for the Dueling Piano's Entertainers. Receipts were \$13,036, which included Admission, Bar, Split the Pot and a Raffle for Chicago Bear's Tickets, donated by a parishioner. When asked by a parishioner, "where did the money go"? I replied, into the general parish funds to support the various ministries of St. Catherine.

There is an important change in the Mass schedule for Christmas Eve. The Family Mass will be in the Alexandria Center at 3:00pm (not 4:15pm). The Mass in Church will be at 4:30pm (not 4:00pm).

Reconciliation during the Season of Advent

During the season of Advent, the Sacrament of Reconciliation often becomes a sacrament of center in faith communities. Children celebrate First Reconciliation during Advent, and parishes often offer communal reconciliation services for all. What is the connection some may ask? What does Advent have to do with Reconciliations? The connection is obvious, Advent is a time to prepare our hearts for the coming of Christ. What better preparation than to receive this beautiful sacrament?

However, many are shy to celebrate this sacrament for many reasons. Some feel shame and are hesitant to speak about their failings aloud. Others wonder what they have done that is so wrong that it requires an intentional moment of confession. Nevertheless, some recognize the value of celebrating the sacrament but are afraid.

Pope Francis reminds us, "There are people who are afraid to go to confession, forgetting that they will not encounter a severe judge there, but the immensely merciful father." And this is the beauty of the sacrament itself. When we come to the Sacrament of Reconciliation, we do not only ask for forgiveness of sins, but we are given this beautiful "Absolution", and that faith truly gives as a "New" fresh start. We all can help kids around us, to bring them to this wonderful sacrament. Catechists and teachers have an opportunity to help others focus on the merciful and loving God that awaits all in the Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation. Thus, we truly appreciate their work and teachings.

St. Catherine of Alexandria has confessions available every Saturday from 3:00 p.m. to 3:45 p.m.

As we continue preparing for Christmas and celebrate this Gaudete Sunday, we rejoice that Jesus is already in our hearts and lives. Let's pray to receive the graces needed to announce his message and presence through our attitudes, actions, and words.












Blessing of a Christmas Manger Nativity Scene (From the USCCB)



In its present form the custom of displaying figures depicting the birth of Jesus Christ owes its origin to St. Francis of Assisi, who made the Christmas crèche or manger for Christmas Eve of 1223.

The blessing of the Christmas manger or nativity scene may take place on the Vigil of Christmas or at another suitable time.

When the manger is set up in the home, it is appropriate that it be blessed by a parent or another family member.

All make the sign of the cross as the leader says:

Our help is in the name of the Lord. R/. Who made heaven and earth.

One of those present or the leader reads a text of sacred Scripture, for example, <u>Luke 2:1</u> (lines 1-8) or <u>Isaiah 7:10</u> (lines 10-15, the birth of Emmanuel).

Reader: The Gospel of the Lord.

R/. Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ.


The leader prays with hands joined:

God of every nation and people, from the very beginning of creation you have made manifest your love: when our need for a Savior was great you sent your Son to be born of the Virgin Mary. To our lives he brings joy and peace, justice, mercy, and love.

Lord,

bless all who look upon this manger; may it remind us of the humble birth of Jesus, and raise our thoughts to him, who is God-with-us and Savior of all, and who lives and reigns forever and ever.

R/. Amen.

Blessing of a Christmas Tree (From the USCCB)

The use of the Christmas tree is relatively modern. Its origins are found in the medieval mystery plays that depicted the tree of paradise and the Christmas light or candle that symbolized Christ, the Light of the world. According to custom, the Christmas tree is set up just before Christmas and may remain in place until the Solemnity of Epiphany. The lights of the tree are illuminated after the prayer of blessing.

In the home the Christmas tree may be blessed by a parent or another family member, in connection with the evening meal on the Vigil of Christmas or at another suitable time on Christmas day.

When all have gathered, a suitable song may be sung.

The leader makes the sign of the cross, and all reply "Amen."

The leader may greet those present in the following words:

Let us glorify Christ our light, who brings salvation and peace into our midst, now and forever. **R/.** Amen

In the following or similar words, the leader prepares those present for the blessing:

My brothers and sisters, amidst signs and wonders Christ Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea: his birth brings joy to our hearts and enlightenment to our minds. With this tree, decorated and adorned, may we welcome Christ among us; may its lights guide us to the perfect light.

One of those present or the leader reads a text of sacred Scripture, for example, <u>Titus 3:4</u> (lines 4-7) or <u>Ezekiel 17:22</u> (lines 22-24; I will plant a tender shoot on the mountain heights of Israel.)

Reader: The Word of the Lord. **R/.** Thanks be to God.

The intercessions are then said. The leader says:

Let us ask God to send his blessing upon us and upon this sign of our faith in the Lord.

R/. Lord, give light to our hearts.

That this tree of lights may remind us of the tree of glory on which Christ accomplished our salvation, let us pray to the Lord. **R/.** Lord, give light to our hearts.

That the joy of Christmas may always be in our homes, let us pray to the Lord. R/. Lord, give light to our hearts.

That the peace of Christ may dwell in our hearts and in the world, let us pray to the Lord.

R/. Lord, give light to our hearts.

After the intercessions the leader invites all present to pray the Lord's Prayer.

The leader says the prayer with hands joined:

Lord our God,
we praise you for the light of creation:
the sun, the moon, and the stars of the night.
We praise you for the light of Israel:
the Law, the prophets, and the wisdom of the Scriptures.
We praise you for Jesus Christ, your Son:
he is Emmanuel, God-with-us, the Prince of Peace,

Lord God,

let your blessing come upon us as we illumine this tree.
May the light and cheer it gives be a sign of the joy that fills our hearts.
May all who delight in this tree come to the knowledge and joy of salvation.
We ask this through Christ our Lord. R/. Amen.

who fills us with the wonder of your love.

The lights of the tree are then illuminated.

The leader concludes the rite by signing himself or herself with the sign of the cross and saying:

May the God of glory fill our hearts with peace and joy, now and forever. **R/.** Amen.

The blessing concludes with a verse from "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel":

O come, thou dayspring, come and cheer our spirits by thine advent here; disperse the gloomy clouds of night and death's dark shadow put to flight. Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel shall come to thee, O Israel.






