



#### Most Reverend Raymond Emil Goedert D.D., JCL

Most Rev. Raymond E. Goedert, Auxiliary Bishop Emeritus for the Archdiocese of Chicago and former Vicar General between 1995 and 2003, passed away Saturday, December 9, 2023. He was 96 years old.

Bishop Goedert was Ordained to the Priesthood on May 1, 1952.

He later attended the Pontifical Gregorian University in Rome where he obtained a Licentiate in Canon Law in 1956. As he was returning to the United States from his studies in Rome aboard the SS Andria Doria, a trans-ocean liner of the Italian Line, the ship collided with another passenger ship, the Stockholm, and sunk 200 miles from New York. In a 2012 Chicago Catholic newspaper article, Bishop Goedert shared his recollections of the collision and the "spiritual implications of what happened."

After Ordination to the Priesthood, Bishop Goedert served as Assistant Pastor at St. Gabriel Parish on Wallace Street and Blessed Sacrament Parish on Millard Street both in Chicago, Mater Christi Parish in North Riverside, and Pastor of St. Barnabas Parish in Chicago.

On July 8,1991, Bishop Goedert was appointed as Auxiliary Bishop of the Archdiocese of Chicago and Titular Bishop of Tamazeni by Pope John Paul II. He was consecrated by Cardinal Joseph Bernardin on August 29, 1991.

"As we grieve the death of Bishop Emeritus Raymond Goedert, we thank God for giving his servant to us and the Church for 71 years," said Cardinal Cupich. "He served the Archdiocese in a variety of roles: As Pastor, Notary, Vicar General and as Administrator of the Archdiocese after Cardinal Bernardin died.

#### The Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph

Sirach 3: 2-6, 12-14; Colossians 3: 12-21; Gospel of Luke 2: 22-40

St. Paul, in his letter to the Colossians, the second reading on this Feast of the Holy Family, points out qualities which not only are commendable in family members, but also in those who pursue discipleship as a way of life. Paul says, "Put on...heartfelt compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness, and patience." That is good advice under almost all circumstances. For us the Holy Family shows us what it means to be a family and how members of a family need to relate to one another. Certainly, all the above virtues speak to relationships between people.

St. Paul suggests that how we treat one another is one of the most important considerations to being a true follower of the Lord. "Overall, these, put on love." How many times does Jesus remind us that the one commandment (Greatest Commandment) to which we need to be faithful is to "love one another?" Love is never easy, just as discipleship is not easy. Love requires effort and commitment, and the willingness to forgive, which Paul also emphasizes. In terms of family relationships, we must work at loving one another, and we especially must strive to forgive one another. St. Paul calls love the "bond of perfection." We cannot be perfect, of course, but we can love if we work at it. And we can use that love to make our relationships within our families better and more complete. Consider taking a moment after mass to say a prayer at the images of our Holy Family for the wisdom and grace to become a holier person. While you're at it remember to pray for those who may have a family member in the military or those families who are struggling.

#### Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God

January 1st; the day we celebrate the oldest and most important feast of Mary. Coming one week after Christmas, it is a second celebration of Jesus' birth with a special focus on Mary as the Mother of God. This title was given to Mary at the Council of Ephesus in 431 A.D.

In the early Church, some claimed that Mary should only be called the mother of the human Jesus and not the mother of God. The council taught, however, that the humanity and divinity of Jesus could not be separated and that they exist in one person—with the momentous implication that we can rightly give Mary the title of Mother of God. Mothers bring life, a gift from God, into the world. That's why you sometimes hear the Church referred to as Mother.

Please consider joining us to praise the Lord on New Year's Eve at 4:00pm Mass or New Year's Day, in the morning, at 8:30am or 10:00am. Celebrating the Eucharist is the perfect way to begin the New Year and its promise of new beginnings. With the way the world is, we sure do need our Savior. I hope that all of you and your loved ones had a Merry Christmas.





# Statement of Cardinal Blase J. Cupich, Archbishop of Chicago, on Declaration, Fiducia Supplicans, Dec. 18, 2023

Today, with the approval of the Holy Father, the Dicastery of the Doctrine of the Faith issued the Declaration *Fiducia supplicans*. The Declaration clarifies that there are forms of blessings, as we see throughout the Scriptures, which are "poured out on others as a gesture of grace, protection, and goodness." Consequently, it is now permissible for ordained ministers of the Church to "join in the prayer of those persons who, although in a union that cannot be compared in any way to a marriage, desire to entrust themselves to the Lord and his mercy, to invoke his help, and to be guided to a greater understanding of his plan of love and of truth." At the heart of the Declaration is a call for pastors to take a pastoral approach by being available to people who, while not claiming a legitimation of their own status, recognize their need for God's help and "who beg that all that is true, good, and humanly valid in their lives and their relationships be enriched, healed, and elevated by the presence of the Holy Spirit." As such, the Declaration is a step forward, and in keeping not only with Pope Francis's desire to accompany people pastorally but Jesus's desire to be present to all people who desire grace and support.

At the same time, the Declaration "remains firm on the traditional doctrine of the Church about marriage, not allowing any type of liturgical rite or blessing similar to a liturgical rite that can create confusion." This is in keeping with what Pope Francis wrote in July of this year, that while "pastoral prudence must adequately discern whether there are forms of blessing, requested by one or more persons, that do not convey an erroneous conception of marriage,...it is not appropriate for a diocese, a bishops' conference, or any other ecclesial structure to constantly and officially establish procedures or rituals for all kinds of matters."

The Declaration is quite specific in this regard, noting that in order "to avoid any form of confusion or scandal, when the prayer of blessing is requested by a couple in an irregular situation, even though it is expressed outside the rites prescribed by the liturgical books, this blessing should never be imparted in concurrence with the ceremonies of a civil union, and not even in connection with them. Nor can it be performed with any clothing, gestures, or words that are proper to a wedding. The same applies when the blessing is requested by a same-sex couple."

Consequently, such blessings should take place "in other contexts, such as a visit to a shrine, a meeting with a priest, a prayer recited in a group, or during a pilgrimage. Indeed, through these blessings that are given not through the ritual forms proper to the liturgy but as an expression of the Church's maternal heart—similar to those that emanate from the core of popular piety—there is no intention to legitimize anything, but rather to open one's life to God, to ask for his help to live better, and also to invoke the Holy Spirit so that the values of the Gospel may be lived with greater faithfulness."

In sum, what is required is a pastoral approach, for the Church, as a loving mother, "must shy away from resting its pastoral praxis on the fixed nature of certain doctrinal or disciplinary schemes, especially when they lead to a narcissistic and authoritarian elitism, whereby instead of evangelizing, one analyzes and classifies others, and instead of opening the door to grace, one exhausts his or her energies in inspecting and verifying... Thus, when people ask for a blessing, an exhaustive moral analysis should not be placed as a precondition for conferring it. For, those seeking a blessing should not be required to have prior moral perfection."

Here in the Archdiocese of Chicago, we welcome this declaration, which will help many more in our community feel the closeness and compassion of God.

There is a common longing in every human heart to be made new, to begin again, because the Holy Spirit encourages it in every human heart. In and through Jesus Christ, there is a path to truly being made new. Every day and every year! With this in mind, I invite you to start a new and a good way how to achieve this is coming to the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Another great way is to forgive others, and let old disputes go away. Regardless of which way you chose. Be assured that the dear God is with you.

Parents and students in the Religious Education Program start again this New Year 2024. Some of our students have been working truly passionately on the completion of their liturgical service hours and their paperwork required to be confirmed. While others have been having a hard time getting around them. Nevertheless, we ask kindly to all our St. Catherine of Alexandria community to keep all of them in your prayers.




#### **Religious Education Gathering**




