

The Sanctuary Lamp burns this coming week for Florence Bingham requested by Beth Patko.


The following is the first paragraph by Kathryn Clarke from her booklet, An Invitation:

"In order to maintain God's
Eucharistic presence in the world,
we require a group of like-minded
people who will provide
companionship for Christ. The only
qualification is that one is willing
to sit in front of a Tabernacle or in



an Adoration Chapel for 30-60 minutes once per week. We often build up to this. How is this different from what we do currently in Eucharistic Adoration? There is no difference. If we are already doing this, we are doing our part to preserve the presence of Christ for the next generation."

Feast of the Baptism of the Lord (Monday, January 8th)

This feast is important for three reasons. Jesus is named by the voice of God who calls him "Son." The Holy Spirit descends upon Jesus and thus anoints him for the destiny he is to fulfill. Since it is John who baptizes, Jesus shows his partnership with sinful humanity. This feast brings the Christmas season to an end.

In the Rite of Baptism, the Ceremony when one is baptized, we begin our baptism ceremony by tracing the Sign of the Cross over the person. Why? Why does that have to come first? Does the cross come first in your life? In what ways do you welcome that cross? In what ways do you avoid the cross? These are good questions to ponder as we reflect upon the sacrament of baptism. The Cross unites us with the Lord. I cannot always explain it well but with the grace from the Lord the crosses I have been given have transformed my hurts into new hope as I journey forward in discipleship. I have grown into closer union with the Lord through the crosses and the transformation (change of heart) that follows.

If the Church is to follow Christ, does that mean that the Church will have to "go to the cross" also, as Jesus did? What does that mean? Do you see the Church trying to avoid the cross at times? Do you see the Church embracing the cross at other times? Pope Francis challenges us (the faithful) to endure our own cross and to help carry the crosses of those who do not have the strength, namely the poor and outcasts of this world.

The other part of the baptismal ceremony I would like for us to reflect upon is the second anointing. That is once the person has been baptized (water being poured over the head). The priest or deacon will say: God the Father of Our Lord Jesus Christ has freed you from sin, given you a new birth by water and the Holy Spirit, and welcomed you into his holy people. He now anoints you with the chrism of salvation. As Christ was anointed Priest, Prophet, and King, so may you live always as a member of his body, sharing everlasting life.

Then the priest or deacon anoints the child on the crown of the head with the sacred chrism. As Disciples of Christ, we are called to love and serve God and others by sharing in Jesus' ministry as priest, prophet, and king. This means that in our daily living we are called to do the following:

As priest: Plead for the needs of the world, make Jesus present to others; intercede for the needs of the world and act as part of God's response to those in needs; help others find God through us.

As prophet: Speak on behalf of the oppressed; clearly speak truth of God's Word; bear witness and evangelize; bring hope to those in despair; speak about injustice.

As king: One who listens to God, serves, and protects the vulnerable; provides for those unable to provide for themselves; love enemies; lay down our lives for others; live with dignity; respect the dignity of others; protect our world and all of God's creation.

At the end of Mass, when the priest or deacon says, "Go in Peace," he is sending us forth on a mission to share in Jesus' ministry as priest, prophet and king.

If we understand this is our charge, then we will better understand what it is we are doing at Mass and how the Mass prepares, challenges, and inspires us to go forth and do just that.

Dear St. Catherine Family of Faith,

The Feast of The Epiphany is commonly associated with Twelfth Night, which is the last day of the Christmas season. It's the time when people put away their Christmas decorations and the Christmas tree is left outside to be collected by the municipality. The birth of Jesus Christ has been celebrated, the shepherds have spread the good news of his birth, the angels have frightened and then comforted everyone, and the arrival of the three wise men with gifts has been hinted at.

Like a medieval pantomime, the story of Christmas has been acted out, and now it is time to pack it away for another year. The story of the three wise men tells us about their long journey that ended with an act of worship and generosity. They offered gifts and surrendered themselves and their possessions to the Lord.

We believe that our own journey in life will be crowned in the same way. At the end of our lives, we will surrender ourselves, everything we have and are, into the hands of the living and loving Lord. Our own worship and self-giving to the Lord throughout our life journey prepares us for this final moment of self-surrender. However, the story also includes the ominous presence of Herod, who asked the same question as the magi but with a very different motive. He wanted to eliminate what he saw as a threat to his throne.

On our faith journey, there will often be forces hostile to God's purpose for our lives. Nevertheless, this assures us that, as the fourth gospel says, "the light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it."

Including in this celebration of Epiphany we also see "The chalking of the doors". This is a centuries-old practice throughout the world, though it appears to be somewhat less well-known. It is, however, an easy tradition to adopt, and a great practice whereby we dedicate ourselves and our year to God from its very beginning, asking His blessing on our homes and on all who live, work, or visit them there. Practicing traditions like the chalking of the doors helps us to live our Faith more concretely and serve as an outward sign of our dedication to Our Lord. Our homes are also the place where many of us will make the greatest improvements in our spiritual growth, through observance of daily prayer, spiritual reading, and work offered as a gift to God.




At St. Catherine of Alexandria, we have this wonderful tradition, and we encourage you to take home one of the small packs with chalk to mark and bless your homes.




