
Preparing for Lent

We begin this Wednesday to prepare for the season of Lent by wearing the sign of the cross. "Turn away from sin and remain faithful to the Gospel" or "Remember that you are dust and to dust you shall return" are the words that will be said to us as the sign of the cross is traced on our foreheads. This significant action will remind us of being faithful to the end and that Christ has claimed us as his creatures by the Sacrament of Baptism.

We are reminded to build one another up as the Body of Christ during this time of renewal and opportunity for spiritual growth.

Our services are as follows: Wednesday, February 14, 6:30am & 8:30am Mass (10am Prayer Service School) 4:15pm Prayer Service and Mass at 7:00pm. Please come and join us as we prepare for the springtime of our lives found in the Resurrection of Christ on Easter Sunday. This Wednesday we begin our journey of faith with ashes on our forehead. It signifies that we are disciples, followers of Christ. What a statement we make as Catholics on Ash Wednesday. This is a wonderful opportunity to assist us on this journey of Lent. Being a priest has taught me that, in ministry, life is unpredictable with many twists and turns of highs and lows. In one day, a priest can go from a funeral, wedding, (Anointing) sacrament of the sick, someone dying, baptism, anniversary, sacrament of reconciliation, and Mass (Eucharist) all in a twenty-four-hour period, so we do understand the highs and lows that the faithful experience.

As you read this column, you may find yourself or your family rejoicing over a great Christmas, job promotion, bonus, good doctor's report, winter vacation in a warm climate (I'm jealous), new birth, recognizing blessings, wedding announcement or some other event in which to rejoice and give thanks to God. Saying to God, why me, what did I do to deserve these blessings?



On the other hand, you may find yourself searching for new employment, marital struggles, newly divorced, mourning the passing of a loved one, economic concerns, worrying how to make ends meet, depression, health concerns, difficulties with children or neighbors, parents in ill health, co-worker issues, or some other kind of strain in which you may ask God, why me? What did I do wrong?


As I also prepare for Lent, know that no matter where you are on this spectrum of life your intentions of thanksgiving or support in struggles will be remembered at the table of praise (Altar) as Fr. Dennis and I pray the Mass with you.

A portion of my prayer time will be devoted praying for your requests of thanksgiving or need. Prayer is the vehicle that will assist us as we strive to understand the concept of discipleship. The gift of time is one of many gifts that the creator has granted us. Yes, time sure flies the older one becomes so we need to use it wisely. Time is a gift that we should not waste or take for granted. The Lord uses his time well to bring about his Father's kingdom. Faith has taught me that time with the Lord in prayer can bless us with many graces especially of gift of peace in the joys and struggles of life. Our God really does care about all creation. God rejoices with us in the good times and cries with us in our sorrows.

As we pray and attend Mass this Lent, let us seek to understand the events of our lives and our purpose on this great planet earth. Faith is the blessed tool in understanding the mysteries of life. I recently heard that you could learn more in an hour of silence than in a year from books. Consider spending some silent time with our God and one another, you may be amazed where it leads you.







Palm Burning

Please bring your old palms to the bins located outside the rectory office and the main church entrance. They


will be burned on Tuesday, February 13th.

Lent + Valentine's Day


